For example, skating, roller-blading, bikes and scooters. In its deputation, the Trust asked that the Community Board codesigned with the neighbouring organisations the process for the community engagement in order to be able to collect the voices of those people who for different reasons usually do not engage with Council.</p> <p>In reality, the engagement process hadn't been codesigned with the community organisations. In fact, no time was actually allocated to the codesign activity. The engagement with the local communities was rushed in less than two months (one of which included January!), a timeframe that does not allow a meaningful and deep engagement. The process instead followed the usual pattern of the Council consultation (informative meetings with PowerPoint presentations during which the community was asked to go online and send their</p>
