There is nothing before us that suggests that the application is not for a genuine event to celebrate Peru National Day, albeit it is slightly later than the actual date, presumably to coincide with a Friday night. Following further investigation by the NZ Police the applicant has accepted conditions that the band shall cease playing at approximately 12 am and that drink sales will cease when the band stops playing or 12.30am, whichever is the earliest. This will allow a further half our for attendees to leave the premises by 1am, which is half an hour earlier than originally applied for.¹ The NZ Police is not opposed to the application on this basis. The Medical Office of Health advised that they were not reporting on the application.

- [4] The Inspectors Report sets out the background to the application and addresses the matters to which regard is to be had in section 142 of the Act.² The Inspector also sets out the agreed amendments to the hours of the application and recommends the grant of the special licence for the event subject to conditions.
