In that instance he again lived some kilometres from the premises seeking the licence.
- [5] After hearing the evidence and the witness being questioned by the Committee it was held that he did not have a status to give him a greater interest in the application than the public generally.
- [6] In the letter of objection attached to the file in this matter dated 14 September 2017 from Mr Hawker, he raised no issues that were not covered at the Hearing on 2 November 2017. Accordingly the Committee finds that he does not have an interest greater than the public

generally in this matter. There are therefore no remaining objections to this application requiring a public hearing to be held.

- [7] No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to s 105 of the Act.

- [2] The current licence number is **060/OFF/72/2016**. The applicant seeks to vary the hours of trade to allow for the sale of alcohol to cease at 10.00pm from Monday to Sunday.
- [3] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 129 accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [4] The applicant makes mention, in a letter to the Committee, that there is an inequitable situation in regards to the ability to advertise product outside the store. He states, and has attached photographs, that two other off licence premises in the area are able to advertise alcohol outside their premises but as the applicant made an undertaking at a public hearing that he would not do this, he is disadvantaged. He has not sought to vary his undertaking but brings to the attention of the Committee that there is a need to be consistent in this regard. The issue of single sales is also raised.
- [5] The Committee is not unaware of these issues but must take each application on its merits and where there is a public hearing the applicant often makes undertakings in light of the issues raised by objectors. Where there are no public objections, and no opposition from the agencies, then the issues raised by this applicant in regards to single alcohol sales and a restriction on external advertising are better addressed in a wider context through a Local Alcohol Policy.

- [6] The Committee relies heavily on the reports of the agencies and these are matters which, if they believe need addressing, could be raised in their reports.
- [7] If the applicant wishes to vary these undertakings in the future it will need to signal this in an application so the agencies are given the opportunity to comment, if they desire.
- [8] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.
- [9] There is no opposition to the variation of the licenced hours and these shall be varied as requested.
- [10] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and the licence renewal is granted, with the variation as sought, for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.130.

Requirements for remote sale by holders of off licences.

- [13] The licence is specifically subject to sections 49 and 59 of the Act relating to times when alcohol must not be delivered and specific requirements on the holder of the licence relating to age verification and other requirements.

The objection

- [6] The objection is made by Mr Wayne Hawker. Mr Hawker has objected to a number of recent licence applications around the city. He live in another suburb of Christchurch and the Alcohol Licensing Inspectors report estimates, with the help of 'Google Maps', that Mr Hawker lives some 5 kilometres away from the premises.
- [7] In a recent decision of the Christchurch District Licensing Committee the Committee determined that to have an interest greater than the public generally, as section 102 of the Act states, the objector must show how they may be affected

by the granting of an application for a licence. Mr Hawker was unable to produce evidence to show that he indeed had an interest greater than the public generally primarily due to the fact he lived some distance from the proposed premises. This is the case in this application, if I was required to address the issue, which I am not.

[8] Mr Hawker did not address the issue of the suitability of the applicant in his objection therefore the objection cannot be taken into account given the criteria as mentioned above at section 102(4) and (4)(A). This being the case I deal with the matter on the papers.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

- [1] This is an application by **Geeta Liquor Merchants Limited** for a new Off-Licence in respect of premises situated at **416 Main South Road, Christchurch**, known as **'Brews Hornby'**.
- [2] This is a new licence for a premise which has traded as a bottle store for many years. The business was sold and has been operating under a Temporary Authority.
- [3] The applicant is a private company and was incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 21 June 2017. The directors and shareholders are Geeta, Murari and Manev Aggrawal. They run a number of off and on licensed premises in the North Island.
- [4] Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health opposed the application in reports as required by section 103. Both agencies however did raise some issues in relation to the applicant's history as a licensee as well as some matters in relation to the layout of the store and external advertising on the premises.
- [5] In regards to the matters raised by the agencies the Alcohol Licensing Inspector's report details these and states that a meeting was held between the agencies and the applicant. The applicant made a number of undertakings, which were addressed very quickly by the applicant subsequent to the meeting.
- [6] There are no reported issues whilst the premise has been trading under a Temporary Authority.
- [7] The application was duly advertised and one public objection was received.
- [8] The applicant seeks conditions consistent with the original licence therefore s.102(4) and (4)(A) applies. These sections state that no objection may be made in relation to any other matter other than the suitability of the applicant if the licence

is of the same kind as that which is currently in force for the premises and the conditions sought by the applicant are the same that apply to the licence already in force.

The objection

- [9] The objection is made by Mr Wayne Hawker. Mr Hawker has objected to a number of recent licence applications around the city. He lives in another suburb of Christchurch and the Alcohol Licensing Inspector's report estimates, with the help of 'Google Maps', that Mr Hawker lives some 16.4 kilometres away from the premises.
- [10] In a recent decision of the Christchurch District Licensing Committee the Committee determined that to have an interest greater than the public generally, as section 102 of the Act states, the objector must show how they may be affected by the granting of an application for a licence. Mr Hawker was unable to produce evidence to show that he indeed had an interest greater than the public generally primarily due to the fact he lived some distance from the proposed premises. This is the case in this application, if I was required to address the issue, which I am not.
- [11]Mr Hawker did not address the issue of the suitability of the applicant in his objection therefore the objection cannot be taken into account given the criteria as mentioned above at section 102(4) and (4)(A). This being the case I deal with the matter on the papers.

The application and premises

- [12] The premise is an established business and is located as part of a large suburban shopping complex.
- [13] In relation to the matters raised by the agencies, and detailed in the Inspector's report, these relate to:
 - The display, advertising and promotion of alcohol in a responsible manner. Dump stacks of RTD's were in the front of the store and 'shots' were displayed at the point of sale. Both these matters have been attended to by the applicant by removing the 'shot's from point of sale and the dump stacks to the rear of the store.
 - Displays of product and pricing in the front windows of the premises. The Inspector reports that these have been removed by applicant.
 - Appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law. A concern was raised regarding this and further information was provided to the Inspector who confirms that this is no longer a concern.
- [14] The Medical Officer of Health also raised concerns regarding the applicant's knowledge of the area surrounding the premises and states that the area has a higher than average number of alcohol outlets and a higher than average level of vulnerable people.

- [15] Concerns were also raised relating to the relinquishing of the site by two 'alcohol franchise groups' and whether this is due to viability and if this is so then there is a risk of product price competition.
- [16] It was acknowledged that the applicant, though living in Auckland, intends to visit the store on a weekly basis and that there will be daily contact with staff. The store security cameras can be monitored by the applicant on a mobile device.

Decision

- [17] The Committee notes the concerns of the agencies and has taken them into account as part of the information placed before it.
- [18] The fact that the applicant flew from Auckland to meet with the agencies and addressed their concerns promptly has also been taken into account.
- [19] When one stands back and evaluates all the information placed before the Committee and views it in the light of the criteria as set out in sections 105 and 106 of the Act it is my view that the granting of this licence would not offend against the object of the Act.
- [20] I am are satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and the licence is granted for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104.

Remote Sales

- [21] Any remote sales are specifically subject to sections 49 and 59 of the Act relating to times when alcohol must not be delivered and specific requirements on the holder of the licence relating age verification and other requirements.
- [22] The applicant's attention is also drawn to section 14 of the Regulations requiring procedures to be put in place in any ordering process to ensure that persons purchasing alcohol are over the minimum purchase age and that any prospective receiver of alcohol (if sent to another person) is also over the minimum purchase age, once when first entering the site and again immediately before the sale of any alcohol is completed.
- [23] In terms of section 15 the internet site must include a legible image of the licence or a clearly identified link to such an image. On every receipt or in every catalogue the Licence holder's name, the licence number and the expiry date of the licence must be printed.
- [24] The licence will be subject to the following conditions and all other conditions as identified on the licence.
- [25] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

DECISION ON THE PAPERS:

- [1] This is an application by Browns of Sumner Limited for the renewal and variation of an off-licence. The premises trades as a grocery store. The application to renew the licence was made on 5 October
- [2] When the renewal was lodged and reports pursuant to s.129 of the Act were required the Medical Officer of Health opposed the application as in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health s.112 had not been complied with and there was unreasonable exposure of alcohol. Police did not oppose the application nor were there any public objections.
- [3] The applicant, after discussions with the Medical Officer of Health's representative, undertook to place a divider in front of the alcohol display thus limiting the exposure of alcohol. The divider has been installed, photographs of which were placed on the application file. The Medical Officer of Health has now withdrawn its opposition.
- [4] In his report the Alcohol Licensing Inspector commended the applicant for making an undertaking that all alcohol purchases would only be authorised by the duty manager. This is an issue that has been raised by some Inspectors. The applicant has obviously front footed this and is to be commended for taking positive steps, not only in regards to the duty manager but also in the placement of the divider to limit alcohol exposure. The undertaking is contained in the applicant's Host Responsibility Policy.

- [5] A waiver is sought in relation to the public notification of the variation. The applicant failed to notify the reduction in the Single Alcohol Area. I do not regard this as fatal, or wilful. Any potential public objectors are not prejudiced in my opinion therefore the waiver is granted.
- [6] As no matters have now been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 129, the report in opposition having been withdrawn as discussed above, I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [7] The Alcohol Licensing Inspector recommends the grant of the licence with the appropriate conditions attached.
- [8] The Inspector reports that he has visited the premises and it is compliant with the SAA plan submitted with the application.
- [9] When a committee has an application such as this before it there are certain mandatory conditions which must be applied to the licence. Section 112 of the Act applies. This states that;
 - (1) The purpose of this section and sections 113 and 114 is to limit (so far as is reasonably practicable) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol.
 - (2) The licensing authority or licensing committee concerned must ensure that, when it issues or renews an off-licence for premises that are a supermarket or grocery store, it imposes on the licence a condition describing one area within the premises as a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol.
 - (3) On the renewal of an off-licence for premises that are a supermarket or grocery store, any single-area condition imposed when the licence was issued (or was last renewed) expires.
 - (4) Subsection (3) is subject to section 115(4).
- [10] This in effect brings the application under sections 113 and 114 of the Act.
- [11] These sections detail the compulsory conditions relating to display, promotion and advertising of alcohol in a single area in supermarkets and grocery stores.
- [12] Any area designated as a single area must promote both the object of the Act and the purpose, or intention, of the condition as set out at section 112(1), "to limit (so far as is reasonably practicable) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol".
- [13] When I stand back and evaluate the application I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out at s's.131 and 132 of the Act, as well as the sections regarding the SAA. A renewal of three years is granted.

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Conditions

Compulsory conditions

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours:
- Monday to Sunday 7.00 am to 10.00 pm
- (c) Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) Single Area Condition: Alcohol Area for display and promotion of alcohol
- Only the area described and delineated on the plan approved by the District Licensing Committee is the permitted area for the <u>display and promotion</u> of alcohol within the premises as required under <u>section 112</u>.

Discretionary conditions

The following are discretionary conditions:

- (a) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
