Staff are all aware of transportation options home. The site is close to the public transport network and taxis and rideshares are encouraged. Staff will call taxis for patrons if required.

c. What other steps does the applicant propose to take aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol?

Food is encouraged with the consumption of alcohol. Staff are trained to identify the sings of intoxication and to implement measures to slow or stop alcohol consumption. Alcohol will not be irresponsibly promoted or unduly discounted.

d. What steps does the applicant propose to take to ensure that the requirements of the Act in relation to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons (i.e. minors, intoxicated persons, other persons to whom alcohol may not be sold pursuant to the licence) are observed?

All signage required under the Sale & Signage of Alcohol Act 2012 is visible to staff and patrons. Minors and intoxicated persons not served alcohol, Appropriate signage is displayed with regards to prohibited persons, acceptable forms of ID and the ID 25 policy

Non-alcoholic beverages provided, water is freely available at all times. Options included no, low and mid strength beers and mocktails,

f. What appropriate systems, staff and training does/will the applicant have in place to ensure compliance with the law?

Duty manager will be on site at all times overseeing the Sale & Supply of alcohol. Staff are trained and experienced and therefore knowledgeable of their obligations

g. What are the current and possible future noise levels and how does the applicant intend to mitigate them?

The site is located in a busy and vibrant part of the central city away from residential areas. It is not a noise sensitive location and the nature of the business is such that mitigation of noise is not necessary.

h. What are the current and possible future levels of nuisance and vandalism and how does the applicant intend to mitigate them?

Current levels of vandalism and nuisance int he area are low. The premise will not give rise to increased effects in this regard. The clientele that the premise attracts are not those that typically induce such behavior.

i. What other licensed premises are there in the vicinity of this proposed premises? And, will the granting of this licence contribute to an increase in alcohol related problems in the area? (Explain)

A number of late night premises is the vicinity which is expected for an entertainment precinct; Wilko, the Last Word, 27 Steps, Casa Publica. A current licence is held, irrespective of granting this will not contribute to an increase in alcohol related problems in the area.

The site and surrounds are commercial and used for commercial activity. The sale and supply of alcohol from this premise will have no effect on neighbouring land uses and will certainly not change it.

Except in the case of a conveyance, within 10 working days after filing this application with the District Licensing Committee, the applicant must ensure that notice of this application in form 7 is attached in a conspicuous place on or adjacent to the site to which this application relates (unless the Secretary of the District Licensing Committee agrees that it is impracticable or unreasonable to do so).
