We have tonic and water available at the bar. An extensive range of non-alcoholics are available around the market

• Low-alcoholic beverages (Between 1.1% and 2.5%ALC):

We will do low alcohol cocktails on request. A 15ml pour of Sloe gin makes a 2.5% version of a G&T

• Alcohol range available (attach full drinks menu)

Off-premise sales Gin & Whisky 700ml plus smaller bottle gift packs. On-premise sales Cocktails & tasting flights.

b. What steps does the applicant propose to take to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises, for staff and patrons?

When asked or if we think it necessary, we will offer to call taxis, ask patron's friends to help them home, put people in an uber, or provide directions to the bus.

c. What other steps does the applicant propose to take aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol?

Encourage patrons to drink water by making sure water jugs and glasses are easily accessible and regularly topped up. Encourage consumption of food - food from anywhere in the market can be brought to the bar.

Assess levels of intoxication and slow down service or halt if required.

d. What steps does the applicant propose to take to ensure that the requirements of the Act in relation to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons (i.e. minors, intoxicated persons, other persons to whom alcohol may not be sold pursuant to the licence) are observed?

Minors and intoxicated persons will not be served.

Intoxicated patrons will be asked to leave and assisted with safe transport options.

Security can be called for support if required.

e. To what extent, where, and how is drinking water intended to be freely available to patrons? (i.e. explain whether water is bar service only, water jugs, or plumbed water stations (and locations)

Water is freely available to patrons through bar service and is offered regularly to guests.

f. What appropriate systems, staff and training does/will the applicant have in place to ensure compliance with the law?

There is a qualified, certified Duty Manager on site at all times. Staff are all experienced with or trained in the sale of alcohol act. They understand their responsibilities and what is required to comply with the law.

g. What are the current and possible future noise levels and how does the applicant intend to mitigate them?

The current noise levels are standard for an open indoor market place and our application should have little impact.

The site is small, patron numbers are limited by the size of the site and music is not an option.

Closing hours are between 5pm and 9pm depending on the day, so late night noise will not be a problem.

h. What are the current and possible future levels of nuisance and vandalism and how does the applicant intend to mitigate them?

Our application should not really have any impact on levels of nuisance and vandalism as we are within the market place and it is a small site and patron numbers are limited. However, monitoring levels of intoxication is the main action we will take in mitigating possible nuissance and vandalism.

i. What other licensed premises are there in the vicinity of this proposed premises? And, will the granting of this licence contribute to an increase in alcohol related problems in the area? (Explain)

The market includes the Canterbury Craft Beer Collective and Mischief Wines with off-licenses and around 10 other outlets that offer alcoholic beverages under a communal on-license. Off license sales may not be consumed in the market and there is no expected increase in consumption in the area based on sales from our off-license. Most of our off-license customers are tourists looking to take something local home.

j. What is the land near the proposed premises being used for? Will the granting of a licence for your premises impact on changing neighbouring land use? If so, in what way?

The premises is within the Riverside Market complex so there is no change in neighbouring land use.
