



The `hangers on` will tend to congregate around the area, & as they will not be skating other activities are likely to be pursued (vandalism, graffiti, drink & drug use, possible the sale of). This has been observed by local residents at Templeton skate park & Washington way (ask for a Police report on Washington way).

The quandary seems to be lighting in the area (not recommended by CPTED),also the CPTED (Sue Ramsay-Metropolitan Community Advisor) was inaccurate in her report regarding graffiti & vandalism. I do hope that Sue Ramsay will do another assessment of the Halswell Domain, to cover the whole site not just one corner.

A suggestion that has been made before by a few people is to have a notice board on site advising those who use the skate park that there are some rules that they should abide by.

Notice Board:-

The hours that the skate park can be used, the NON use of `ghetto blasters`

A kindly reminder that if they bring anything that creates rubbish that they take it home. (as the CCC does not supply rubbish bins in public parks).

That the park is for beginners to intermediate users, with the emphasis on sharing the park. That in the case of an accident, the number to call is 111 for ambulance service. A CCC phone number that people can call to remove any graffiti. That the gate will be locked at a set time.

If the skate park is to go ahead, set some standards for the `beginners to intermediate users` so they can strive to achieve, I hope the CCC is not expecting them to set their own rules !

That would be like asking them to vote in the next CCC election.....



This has been observed by local residents at Templeton skate park & Washington way (ask for a Police report on Washington way).</p> <p>The quandary seems to be lighting in the area (not recommended by CPTED),also the CPTED (Sue Ramsay-Metropolitan Community Advisor) was inaccurate in her report regarding graffiti & vandalism. I do hope that Sue Ramsay will do another assessment of the Halswell Domain, to cover the whole site not just one corner.</p> <p>A suggestion that has been made before by a few people is to have a notice board on site advising those who use the skate park that there are some rules that they should abide by.</p> <p><i>Notice Board:-</i></p>	<p>Staff are working alongside the design team for the Quarryman's Major Cycleway Trail. The design team are aware of the requirements to ensure that any light installed will be shrouded to avoid any spill over into this area.</p> <p>2) & 2) We have amended the design for the skate and recreation park at Halswell Domain and replaced the platform and small quarter pipe you are concerned about, with a rollover and ½ pipe instead, this will then not able to be used in the same way as a jump.</p> <p>4) Landscaping and trees will be considered as part of the detailed design. We can then look at size and scales of trees.</p> <p>A CPTED report will be completed on both concept designs following consultation to ensure CPTED principles are met. This report will be included with the staff report to the Community Board.</p> <p>We are planning to install signage that will include skate park etiquette that will be developed with the community. This signage will include the site address as well as emergency phone numbers.</p> <p>There will be a litter bin included in the concept plan. This will either be a new litter bin or one relocated from elsewhere within Halswell Domain.</p>
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The hours that the skate park can be used, the NON use of `ghetto blasters`

A kindly reminder that if they bring anything that creates rubbish that they take it home. (as the CCC does not supply rubbish bins in public parks).

That the park is for beginners to intermediate users, with the emphasis on sharing the park. That in the case of an accident, the number to call is 111 for ambulance service. A CCC phone number that people can call to remove any graffiti. That the gate will be locked at a set time.

If the skate park is to go ahead, set some standards for the `beginners to intermediate users` so they can strive to achieve, I hope the CCC is not expecting them to set their own rules !

That would be like asking them to vote in the next CCC election.....
