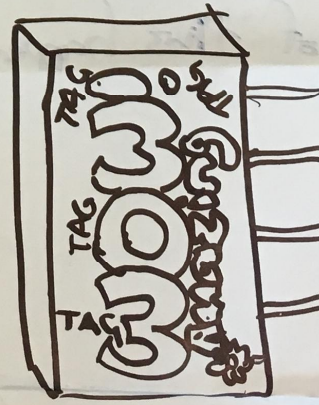
A real big one!



- enough "rollover" ramps so scooters don't scrape on them
- ramps that start at different heights so kids can progress through skill levels
- have a rollover option for a half pipe
- a seating area with shade sails or other cover for parents - Thanks very much to drinking fountain



- different designs and feature for Domain vs. Knight's stream
- At the Domain, use the contour of the land for natural incline
- A couple REALLY HIGH ramps! (like REALLY HIGH)

* Could we have a pump track for small kids on scooters and balance bikes plus small 1/4 pipe(s) and plenty of small obstacles for rail slides + jumps at the domain. The ideal (to me) would allow a large number of kids to be in motion at once.

For Knights Stream could we have slightly more aggressive obstacles on this largest site to complement the domain and Prebbleton Skate parks. In my view (check with the kids) this could be a bowl (or two), larger ramps + higher rail slides.

It is important that both sites include rail slides. The local kids have started using kerbs, but this exposes them to danger from cars and if they could be directed to a local park this might reduce the amount of this happening / likelihood of a fatality.
