Hi Alison,

Thank you for your email and letting us know about the submissions you've received on the proposed plan change. Just for your information, Avi is still on secondment until next month.

The working group was established last year to analyse STRA issues to develop a better understanding of the impact of STRA on the tourism sector and housing market. This group and work programme have since been put on hold following the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry. We are focused on other Ministerial priorities at this time. I'm afraid we don't have anything to share publically on the progress of the work, or any timeframes for recommendations at this stage.

On a side note, depending on any delays to your process, it could be useful to engage with the RMA reform process as it could be an opportunity to align potential district plan changes. The Natural and Built Environments Act (NBA) and Strategic Planning Acts (SPA) are expected to be introduced into Parliament by the end of 2021.
