Building description:	Large brick 2 storey building with older portions going back to pre-1909 and some newer additions. All areas have been affected by earthquakes, vandalism and fire and are unsuitable for occupation.
Notes:	The site is vacant but is frequented by squatters, trespassers and vandals despite security fencing, locks, cameras and signs.

	<ol> <li>The entire building structure at the address has been affected by fire, quakes, vandalism and weather penetration to some extent or other.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Not all of the site was accessible to undertake assessment – I was advised and guided by Richard Gant regarding safe areas to approach.</li> </ol>
	<ol><li>The yard and outbuildings are overgrown and also appear to be in a dilapidated condition.</li></ol>
	<ol> <li>Complaints have been received regarding rodents on the property and there is harbourage available onsite to shelter rats amongst the debris and demolition material.</li> </ol>
Potable water	Town supply and artesian well – reticulation damaged by fire and quakes –
	not in a functional condition due to the dilapidated nature of the site.
Sanitary Facilities	Non-functional due to the dilapidated, partially demolished nature of the site.
Drainage/Spouting/Roof	Non-functional due to the dilapidated, partially demolished nature of the site.


Hazardous material	The widespread presence of degraded asbestos material in several forms throughout means the site can be considered potentially injurious to health under S123 of the Building Act 2004.
Overall Comments:	That in its current state, the building at 265 Riccarton Road, Christchurch is insanitary under S123 of the Building Act 2004 due to:  a. Being offensive or injurious to health because it is in a state of disrepair; and  b. Having insufficient or defective provisions against moisture penetration so as to cause dampness in the building; and  c. Not having a functional supply of potable water that is adequate for its intended use; and  d. Not having functional sanitary facilities that are adequate for its intended use.


















