



Important safety information for cyclists in the Central City

There are new ways of getting into the city with cycle paths, new pedestrian crossings and new bus movements.

What's changed?

There are new separated cycle lanes outside the new Bus Interchange on Tuam Street. Buses will turn across the cycle lane to enter and exit the Interchange.

When buses have a green bus-only light, cyclists have a red cycle-only stop light. Cyclists will be warned that a red light is coming by on-road orange flashing LED lights.

When?

Buses will be in training around the new Bus Interchange from Thursday 30 April 2015 so please be aware of bus movements from then on.

What cyclists need to do

Outside the new Bus Interchange cyclists need to get ready to stop when the on-road orange LED lights flash. They are a warning the cycle-only crossing signal is about to turn red.

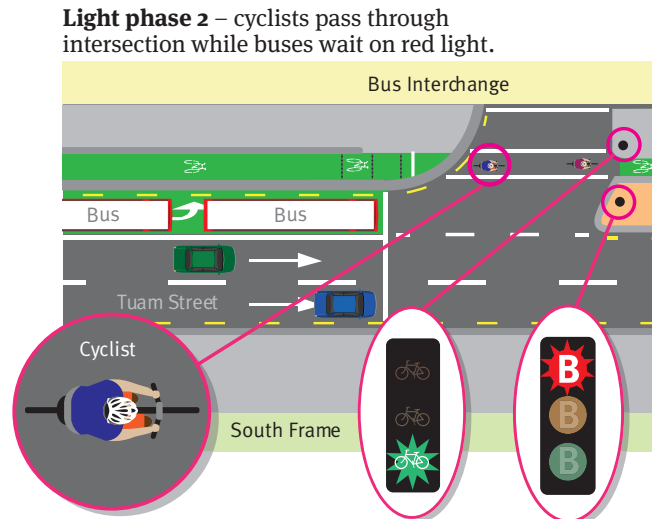
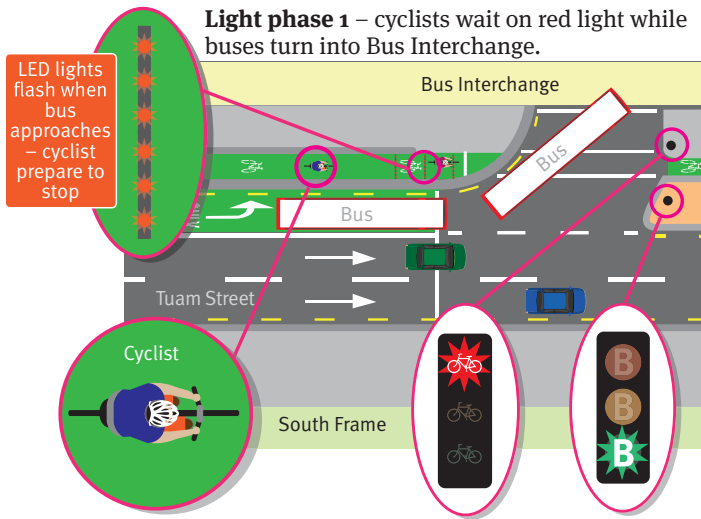
Be prepared to stop. Do not ignore the red stop signal – when your light is red buses will cross your lane into the new Bus Interchange.
