



Park smarter around schools

Common parking restrictions

Parking restrictions are in place to help keep everyone safe and reduce congestion.





This will be at the safest drop-off and pick-up place. You can stop here for three minutes only – enough time for children to say goodbye and leave the car.

This means parking is restricted to the number of minutes on the sign. P120 means you can only stop there for 120 minutes.




Broken yellow lines along the edge of the road mean you can't stop, pull over, or park there at any time.

You must leave a one metre gap between your car and any driveway.



You must not park your car on the footpath or in a way that blocks the footpath.

You must not stop or park within six metres of any crossing or intersection.



Breaking these rules can result in a fine.



Common parking fines

Stopped/parked on broken yellow lines	\$60
Stopped/parked on or within 6 metres of a pedestrian crossing	\$60
Stopped/parked on a footpath	\$40
Stopped/parked over or within 1 metre of a vehicle entrance	\$40
Parked within 50cm of a fire hydrant with no legal driver in the car	\$40
Double parked (parking next to another vehicle that is parked parallel to the road)	\$60
Stopping or parking in a way that is inconsiderate to other road users, including pedestrians	\$60
No evidence of current inspection (Warrant of Fitness)	\$200
Current licence label not affixed in a prescribed manner (or expired)	\$200
Parking on a bus stop	\$60
Parking on a loading zone	\$40
