Dudley Creek Project - Overview

The Dudley Creek flood remediation works have progressed after extensive consultation with the community, where several options were considered, taking into account their impact on residents and the environment, and reducing the flood risk in the Flockton area.

The Stapletons Road option that was chosen had the added advantage of enhancing the landscape in the longer term, with an improved overall quality of trees, and improved walkways and access to the waterway.

What we are doing

As outlined in the bypass overview notice delivered to residents on the 27th April, some trees on Medway Street and North Parade need to be removed so that crews can undertake service relocation work ahead of the piped bypass works.

These trees will be removed on Tuesday 7 June.

You will receive more information about the service relocation work next week.



Around 70,000 new plants will be planted upon completion of the project next year as part of extensive landscaping, with semi-mature trees being planted along the bypass route.

The planting of approximately 7000 plants is underway at stage one running from Slater Street to Chancellor Street and along Julius Terrace, with stage two planting due to start in mid June.
