DECISION ON THE PAPERS

- [1] This is an application by the **Canterbury Jockey Club Incorporated** for the renewal of the On-licence in respect of premises situated at **165 Racecourse Road, Christchurch** known as **'Riccarton Park Function Centre'**.
- [2] The current license number is **60/ON/102/2016**, having just been varied by the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority in May of this year.
- [3] The general nature of the premise is that of a Function Centre and Racecourse. The applicant has been trading since being incorporated in 1900.

Preliminary Matters

- [4] The Alcohol Licensing Inspector initially questioned the ability of the applicant to hold an on-licence in view of section 29(1) of the Act.
- [5] The Inspector rightly states in his report, "However the Canterbury Jockey Club Incorporated initially held a Food and Entertainment Licence issued pursuant to the 1962 Act. This licence was converted to an on-licence under the 1989 Act in 1990. The transitional provisions under the current Act allow this licence to continue to be held by the applicant".
- [6] Section 413(f) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 confirms the comments of the Inspector.

- [7] This renewal application was made on 20 May 2015. The report of the Inspector outlines the reasons for the delay as being due to concerns with the sale and supply of alcohol on the Christchurch NZ Cup & New Zealand Bloodstock 1000 Guineas Day which is held annually at the applicant's premises.
- [8] An application for renewal was initially opposed by both the Police and Medical Officer of Health.
- [9] The Police recently lodged an application to the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority (ARLA) for suspension and/or variation of the on-licence. The variation sought the exclusion of the Christchurch Casino NZ Cup and New Zealand Bloodstock 1000 Guineas race day (NZ Cup Day) from the on-licence.
- [10] Before the scheduled hearing the Police, and the applicant in this matter, filed a consent memorandum whereby the licensee agreed to have 'Cup Day' excluded from the on-licence. In its decision [2016] NZARLA 130-131 the Authority stated at paragraph [7] "*The Authority approves the conciliatory and pragmatic resolution suggested by the parties and consents to the vacation of the fixture*".
- [11] A new licence was issued with condition (b) varied as follows;

(b) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours: On such days and during such hours as the premises are being operated as a function centre but not other than on the following days and hours: Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 1.00am the following day; EXCEPT THAT no liquor may be sold, supplied or consumed pursuant to this licence on the day on which the Christchurch Casino NZ Cup and New Zealand Bloodstock 1000 Guineas are being held.

- [12] The licensee also received a negative holding in terms of s.289 of the Act.
- [13] With the agreed variation of the licence, after the matter was decided by ARLA on the papers, both the Police and Medical Officer of Health withdrew their respective opposition to the renewal of the on-licence.
- [14] The application was advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.
- [15] With the withdrawal of the reports in opposition there are now no reports in opposition in any reports as required by section 129. I therefore deal with the matter on the papers.

The Renewal Application

[16] The applicant has emailed the Inspector and confirms that it now seeks to amend the application and agrees to the conditions as set out in the varied licence issued by ARLA in May of this year. As the applicant seeks the same terms and conditions as the licences currently in force section 102(4) applies.

- [17] An extensive menu and Host Responsibility Policy were included with the application.
- [18] A waiver is sought under s.208 due to errors in the public notices namely the public notice did not include the exclusion condition as in the new varied licence and the hours were also incorrect.
- [19] The waiver is granted as I do not believe that any potential objector would have been prejudiced by the incorrect wording of the public notice. The hours are the same as on the current licence and the new varied hours are more restrictive than the previous licence.
- [20] I reiterate the comments of the Authority in commending the applicant and the agencies in the conciliatory and pragmatic way in which a resolution has been achieved in both the variation and renewal of the on-licence.
- [21] It is now for the applicant to live up to the challenge of managing its premises within the restrictions of the new legislation and uphold the object of the Act.
- [22] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and the renewal is granted for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.130.
- [23] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).
- [24] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

Compulsory conditions - section 110 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No Alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on ANZAC Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

- [1] In November 2015 a decision was issued by the Christchurch District Licensing Committee (CDLC), **60A [2015] 2764b**, for a new On-licence to the applicant in this matter **The Rockpool Limited** in respect of premises situated at **85 Hereford Street, Christchurch**, known as '**The Rockpool**'.
- [2] This is the re-hearing of that application.
- [3] The re-hearing arises from an application by the New Zealand Police for the matter to be re-heard after concerns were raised that an outside area described in the licence was not adequately described in the application and therefore the Police were prejudiced in their ability to report on the application fully. The concerns centred on the hours and location of the outside area.
- [4] The Committee in a minute dated the 7th of April 2016 granted the re-hearing and sought fresh reports from the agencies. The only issue in contention was the outside area at the front of the premises and the hours attached to it.

- [5] The general nature of the premise is that of a Tavern.
- [6] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.
- [7] The application arises from the formation of a new company to run an established business. It is currently trading under a Temporary Authority.
- [8] The premise is located in an inner city and trades as a bar, restaurant and pool hall.
- [9] The director of the applicant company will be hands on in the running of the business. He has experience in the hospitality industry gained over many years.
- [10] No other matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103 accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [11] In the original hearing there were three additional conditions included in the licence. They were as follows;

1/ The applicant shall within 3 months of the granting of a licence complete a comprehensive staff training manual.

2/ The applicant shall within 3 months of the granting of a licence complete a comprehensive Alcohol Management Plan.

3/ The applicant shall within 3 months of the granting of a licence complete a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) audit of the premises, and also the immediate area surrounding the premises (100m radius). A report shall be compiled outlining the results of the audit.

[12] These conditions have been satisfied and are therefore no longer required. They shall not be part of the re-issued licence.

The outside area

- [13] The committee acknowledges the work of the agencies, applicant and the Council footpath leasing section in resolving any issues regarding the licensing of the outside area.
- [14] There are no outstanding issues in this regard and the area has now been detailed on a plan and in photos submitted to the CDLC. There is a now a new lease for the outside area in place.
- [15] The hours that have been agreed upon for the outside area are 8.00am to 11.00pm. The area shall be undesignated until 6.00pm and from 6.00pm to 11.00pm it shall have a supervised designation.

- [16] The representative of the Medical Officer of Health, in her report, sought the hours of the outside area be granted for 8.00am to 10.00pm. I have considered this but both the Police and the Alcohol Licensing Inspector sought 11.00pm, and that it was the Police who raised the issue and are satisfied with an 11.00pm close.
- [17] I have set the outdoor areas hours as 8.00am to 11.00pm, Monday to Sunday. These of course can be reported on by the agencies at the first renewal of the licence.
- [18] I do however take note of the comments of the representative of the Medical officer of Health where she states, "The applicant however, would need to have sufficient staff and systems in place to manage the outdoor area". I would endorse this statement and the applicant would be wise to consider this when allowing patrons to use the outdoor area.

Decision

- [19] I am satisfied as to the matters to which must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and I grant the licence for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104 of the Act.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

- [1] In November 2015 a decision was issued by the Christchurch District Licensing Committee (CDLC), **60A [2015] 2764b**, for a new On-licence to the applicant in this matter **The Rockpool Limited** in respect of premises situated at **85 Hereford Street, Christchurch**, known as '**The Rockpool**'.
- [2] This is the re-hearing of that application.
- [3] The re-hearing arises from an application by the New Zealand Police for the matter to be re-heard after concerns were raised that an outside area described in the licence was not adequately described in the application and therefore the Police were prejudiced in their ability to report on the application fully. The concerns centred on the hours and location of the outside area.
- [4] The Committee in a minute dated the 7th of April 2016 granted the re-hearing and sought fresh reports from the agencies. The only issue in contention was the outside area at the front of the premises and the hours attached to it.

- [5] The general nature of the premise is that of a Tavern.
- [6] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.
- [7] The application arises from the formation of a new company to run an established business. It is currently trading under a Temporary Authority.
- [8] The premise is located in an inner city and trades as a bar, restaurant and pool hall.
- [9] The director of the applicant company will be hands on in the running of the business. He has experience in the hospitality industry gained over many years.
- [10] No other matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103 accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [11] In the original hearing there were three additional conditions included in the licence. They were as follows;

1/ The applicant shall within 3 months of the granting of a licence complete a comprehensive staff training manual.

2/ The applicant shall within 3 months of the granting of a licence complete a comprehensive Alcohol Management Plan.

3/ The applicant shall within 3 months of the granting of a licence complete a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) audit of the premises, and also the immediate area surrounding the premises (100m radius). A report shall be compiled outlining the results of the audit.

[12] These conditions have been satisfied and are therefore no longer required. They shall not be part of the re-issued licence.

The outside area

- [13] The committee acknowledges the work of the agencies, applicant and the Council footpath leasing section in resolving any issues regarding the licensing of the outside area.
- [14] There are no outstanding issues in this regard and the area has now been detailed on a plan and in photos submitted to the CDLC. There is a now a new lease for the outside area in place.
- [15] The hours that have been agreed upon for the outside area are 8.00am to 11.00pm. The area shall be undesignated until 6.00pm and from 6.00pm to 11.00pm it shall have a supervised designation.

- [16] The representative of the Medical Officer of Health, in her report, sought the hours of the outside area be granted for 8.00am to 10.00pm. I have considered this but both the Police and the Alcohol Licensing Inspector sought 11.00pm, and that it was the Police who raised the issue and are satisfied with an 11.00pm close.
- [17] I have set the outdoor areas hours as 8.00am to 11.00pm, Monday to Sunday. These of course can be reported on by the agencies at the first renewal of the licence.
- [18] I do however take note of the comments of the representative of the Medical officer of Health where she states, "The applicant however, would need to have sufficient staff and systems in place to manage the outdoor area". I would endorse this statement and the applicant would be wise to consider this when allowing patrons to use the outdoor area.

Decision

- [19] I am satisfied as to the matters to which must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and I grant the licence for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104 of the Act.
- [20] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).
- [21] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.
- [22] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory conditions - section 110 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No Alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on ANZAC Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold the following days and during the following hours;
