DECISION 'ON THE PAPERS'

This application seeks a licence to allow the sale of alcohol during a social event run by the applicant. The event is a BBQ for members of the society.

The event is proposed to take place at the 'University of Canterbury Rugby Football Clubrooms and the surrounding carpark on Friday 30 September 2016 from 3.00pm to 5.00pm. The BBQ is a 2-3 hour social event where students arrive in a dress up theme and a band plays. Alcohol is included in the ticket price. Professional security are in attendance.

Originally the New Zealand Police opposed the application until a meeting with the organisers could be held with the applicant. A meeting was held between the agencies and the applicant and during the meeting the duration of the event was discussed. The applicant has reduced the duration stating it was a mistake in the application to seek a 30 minute extension on last year's event.

The Police have now withdrawn their opposition and the agencies are now satisfied that the applicant has the systems in place to comply with the Act.

As there are no reports in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1), I deal with the matter on the papers.

Having said that there are now no reports in opposition I turn to the reports of the representative of the Medical Officer of Health, who reported no opposition in her

original report but subsequently sent a supplementary report to the Committee on the 22nd of September 2016.

The report raised concerns regarding the running of the recent 'Roundie 500' (an event organised by the same applicant as this application). The report included "Whilst I am aware that this special licence event is a static event, I would like to draw the committee's attention to my concerns regarding the potential for this event to escalate should the organisers not manage the event as outlined in their comprehensive management plan".

The Alcohol Licensing Inspector, in his report, stated "*I am aware of the problems with the "Roundie 500" that was held recently in Canterbury and agree the behaviour of the students was unacceptable and very disappointing given the support from the reporting agencies to help them get it right. I do not believe the 'Roundie 500' should be allowed to occur again. A special licence was not required for this event.*

Regarding this application, I still believe it is better for these types of events to occur on University grounds by way of a special licence than on private property without a licence. However the applicants have been warned of the high standards we expect at this BBQ and that the event will be monitored....Further special licences for ENSOC BBQ's will be opposed if monitoring agencies are not happy with how this event is run."

Given the comments of all three agencies and the concerns that have been raised regarding the behaviour of the attendees and ability of the management of these events to run the event well, the applicant needs to realise that the ongoing support of the agencies may well be in doubt if they do not live up to the standard as set out in the comprehensive Alcohol Management Plan.

The committee supports the agencies and puts the applicant on notice that its suitability in any subsequent application will inevitably be judged not only on the management of the event but also the behaviour of its members at this and other associated events.

The applicant has the opportunity to help uphold the intention and object of this Act by managing their events well. To allow its members to perpetuate the ongoing binge drinking culture is not acceptable and they have both a social and legal responsibility to be part of positive culture change in relation to the consumption of alcohol.

I did give thought to requiring a public hearing into this matter, under the authority of s. 202(1) of the Act, given the comments of the reporting agencies and the need to make it abundantly clear to the applicant that the granting of a licence is not a forgone conclusion, nor is it a right, but it is a privilege granted to those who are deemed suitable and responsible enough to uphold their obligations under the Act. I also gave thought to placing far greater restrictive conditions on the licence such as low strength alcohol only and a greater supply of food but will leave the agencies to look at these if their concerns are realised. I have decided by a very narrow margin to deal with this matter 'on the papers'.

The applicants must now realise that even without opposition from the agencies any future application may be heard at a public hearing where they will be required to prove

that they are a suitable applicant to be issued a special licence and where the application may be refused or more restrictive conditions placed on a licence.

A qualified manager will oversee the supply of alcohol. Food and entertainment will been provided.

It is expected that approximately 800 people will attend the event.

A restricted designation is sought and shall apply. Patrons shall only be supplied with one drink at a time.

An 'Alcohol management Plan' has been submitted with the application and this is to be read as undertakings and conditions of the licence.
